### **Partial Closure of SR 25/NE 36 Street at NE 1 Avenue for Traffic Signal Mast Arm Installation March 12**

**Miami, Fla.** – On Thursday, March 12, 2020, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will partially close the intersection of SR 25/NE 36 Street at NE 1 Avenue in order to install the two remaining traffic signal mast arms. The operation is scheduled to take place between the hours 9:30 a.m. and 12 p.m., with the installation of each traffic signal mast arm lasting approximately 10-15 minutes.

Traffic will be stopped for a short period of time along eastbound SR 25/NE 36 Street at NE 1 Avenue in order to install the first mast arm safely. Crews will then close the right turn lane of westbound SR 25/NE 36 Street to northbound NE 1 Avenue for a short period of time in order to install the second mast arm safely. Law enforcement will be onsite directing traffic through the area during the operation.

**Drivers should anticipate delays traveling through this area and seek alternate routes if possible. Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.**
