## **Full Closure to Occur on West 65 Street**

*State Road (SR) 823/NW 57 Avenue/West 4 Avenue/Red Road*

---

**Hialeah, FL** – Starting August 15, 2016, a full closure will occur on West 65 Street from NW 57 Avenue/West 4 Avenue/Red Road to West 2 Court while the contractor continues with water main installation and reconstruction activities. This will be a 24-hour closure and will last approximately one month, weather permitting. A detour will be in place, but motorists are encouraged to seek alternate routes. Please note that northbound and southbound traffic on Red Road will not be affected.

### **Drivers traveling east on West 65 Street:**

- Turn right on Red Road and head south towards West 62 Street
- Turn left on West 62 Street and head east towards West 2 Avenue
- Turn left on West 2 Avenue and head north towards West 65 Street
- Turn right on West 65 Street

### **Drivers traveling west on West 65 Street:**

- Continue on West 65 Street towards West 2 Court, which then turns into West 68 Street
- Turn left on Red Road and head south towards West 65 Street
- Turn right on West 65 Street

This work is part of the overall improvements along SR 823/NW 57 Avenue/West 4 Avenue, underway from West 53 Street to West 84 Street in the City of Hialeah. The project began January 2015 and is estimated to last through June 2017 with an estimated cost of almost \$41 million.

**Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.**
