## Full Closure of State Road (SR) 5/US 1/South Dixie Highway in Coral Gables

---

**Miami, FL — The Miami-Dade County Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW), in coordination with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), will close all travel lanes on US 1/South Dixie Highway from South Alhambra Circle to Augusto Street from 11:30 p.m. Friday, December 9 until 6 a.m. Saturday, December 10.**

**Drivers on northbound US 1/South Dixie Highway can:**

- Turn left on South Alhambra Circle, turn right on Ponce De Leon Boulevard
- Turn right on Augusto Street, turn left at US 1/South Dixie Highway

**Drivers on southbound US 1/South Dixie Highway can:**

- Turn right on Augusto Street, turn left on Ponce De Leon Boulevard
- Turn left on South Alhambra Circle, turn right on US 1/South Dixie Highway

**Note: Access to local streets and businesses will be maintained. Local traffic should follow posted detour routes.**

The closure will allow the DTPW to erect a new pedestrian bridge over US 1/South Dixie Highway to provide a safer crossing for pedestrians and bicyclists at Mariposa Court. Elevators and escalators will provide easy access to the overpass from both sides of US 1/South Dixie Highway. **Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions.**
