Upcoming Eastbound Closure of NW 135 Street at Red Road

State Road (SR) 823/NW 57 Avenue/West 4 Avenue/Red Road

Hialeah, FL – Starting **Friday, January 13, 2017 at 9 p.m.**, an eastbound closure will occur on NW 138 Street/NW 135 Street at NW 57 Avenue/West 4 Avenue/Red Road while the contractor performs water main activities on the southeast corner of the intersection. A detour will be in place to guide motorists around the work zone. The detour is scheduled to last until **5 a.m. on Monday, January 16, 2017**.

Drivers traveling eastbound on NW 138 Street/NW 135 Street can:

- Turn right on Red Road and head south towards West 68 Street
- Turn left on West 68 Street and head east towards LeJeune Road
- Turn left on LeJeune Road and head north towards NW 138 Street/NW 135 Street
- Turn right back onto eastbound NW 138 Street/NW 135 Street

Westbound traffic on NW 138 Street/NW 135 Street will remain as is.

Drivers traveling northbound on Red Road who wish to go east on NW 138 Street/NW 135 Street can utilize the detour in place via West 68 Street and LeJeune Road.

Drivers traveling southbound on Red Road who wish to go east on NW 138 Street/NW 135 Street can utilize the detour in place via West 68 Street and LeJeune Road.

This work is part of the overall improvements along SR 823/NW 57 Avenue/West 4 Avenue, underway from West 53 Street to West 84 Street in the City of Hialeah. The project began January 2015 and is estimated to last through April 2017 with an estimated cost of almost \$41 million.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
