State Road (SR) 5/US 1/Biscayne Boulevard and SR 25/US 27/NE 36 Street

Roadway Projects Begin the Week of June 5, 2017

Miami, FL – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin two roadway construction projects the week of June 5, 2017. The project limits extend along SR 5/US 1/Biscayne Boulevard from NE 32 Street to NE 38 Street and along SR 25/US 27/NE 36 Street from North Miami Avenue to east of NE 5 Avenue in the City of Miami. The combined construction cost is an estimated \$1.8 million. The work will take roughly six months to be completed. The projects include the following:

- Installing raised medians and widening the roadway at various locations
- Upgrading roadway signs and pedestrian ramps
- Adjusting the traffic signals at NE 33 Street and NE 36 Street
- Adjusting bus stops at various locations
- Installing high emphasis crosswalks at NE 33 Street and NE 36 Street
- Repaving and restriping the roadway
- Trimming landscaping for visibility of stop signs and traffic signals

Project ID: 429159-2-52-01 – SR 25/US 27/NE 36 Street

- Repaving and restriping the roadway
- Upgrading pedestrian ramps
- Upgrading roadway signs and pavement markings
- Installing countdown pedestrian signals at the intersection of North Miami Avenue and NE 36 Street

To build these projects safely, it will be necessary to periodically close lanes. Construction will be done in stages to minimize impacts to the public during special events and peak periods of traffic. The department will make sure traffic continues to flow safely through the work zones.
