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**UPDATED: State Road (SR) 90/US 41/
SW 8 Street/Tamiami Trail Bridge Project**
60-Hour, Continuous Flagging Operation Rescheduled to Begin June 13

Miami, FL – Beginning at 8 a.m. on Tuesday, June 13, the contractor for the SR 90/US 41/SW 8 Street/Tamiami Trail Bridge Project will prepare to place traffic on a newly widened section of roadway from Everglades Safari Park to east of Osceola Camp. A continuous flagging operation will be in place for approximately 60 hours to allow for the traffic shift to be established. During this time, only one travel lane will be open on this section of Tamiami Trail. Once the switch is complete, one eastbound and one westbound lane will be open on the north side of this section of roadway. This traffic shift was rescheduled because of inclement weather.

The continuous flagging operation will take place from 8 a.m. on June 13 through the evening of Thursday, June 15. Flaggers will be directing traffic during the work and will temporarily stop one direction of traffic at a time for up to 15 minutes. Additional flaggers will be used during daytime hours at Everglades Safari Park. Allow extra time to reach your destination.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
