## State Road (SR) 932/NW 103 Street/West 49 Street

*Safety Project Begins the Week of March 19*

---

**Miami, FL** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a safety project the week of March 19, 2018. The project limits extend along State Road (SR) 932/NW 103 Street/West 49 Street from SR 826/Palmetto Expressway Interchange to East 5 Avenue in the City of Hialeah. A Public Information Meeting will take place to discuss this project from **6 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Tuesday, February 13, at the Goodlet Park Auditorium, 4200 West 8 Avenue, Hialeah, Florida 33012**. FDOT representatives will provide an overview of the project and will be available to answer questions.

The project will cost an estimated \$1.2 million. The work will take roughly seven months to be completed. The project includes the following:

- Repaving and resurfacing the road as needed
- Extending turning lanes as needed to allow more capacity
- Installing high emphasis crosswalks
- Upgrading pedestrian and roadway signs
- Upgrading pedestrian crosswalk push buttons
- Modifying traffic signals
- Modifying medians as needed
- Modifying driveways as needed

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to periodically close lanes. Construction will be done in stages to minimize impacts to the public during special events and peak periods of traffic. The department will make sure traffic continues to flow safely through the work zones.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
