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State Road (SR) 992/SW 152 Street/Coral Reef Drive Project Completed Early

Miami, FL – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) completed the SR 992/SW 152 Street/Coral Reef Drive Project forty-eight days early and within budget. The project started on May 22, 2017 and received final acceptance on February 7, 2018. The project limits extend along SR 992/SW 152 Street/Coral Reef Drive from SR 821/HEFT/Florida’s Turnpike to SR 5/US 1/South Dixie Highway, in Miami-Dade County. The project featured \$2.7 million in roadway and safety improvements, including the following work:

- Repaving and restriping the road
- Upgrading pedestrian ramps to current standards
- Replacing isolated drainage structures
- Modifying the median at the intersections of SW 102 Avenue and SW 107 Avenue
- Enhancing signalization
- Repairing the bridge deck
- Widening existing westbound outside lane from SW 93 Avenue to 500 feet west of SW 93 Avenue
- Extending eastbound left turn lane at SW 93 Avenue and US 1
- Providing an exclusive left turn lane for the public library
- Modifying the existing driveway entrance at Jackson South Community Hospital
- Installing signage and pavement markings

FDOT completed this project early and within budget with the support of elected officials and the community. Halley Engineering Contractors Inc. was the contractor.
