State Road (SR) 5/US 1/South Dixie Highway

Roadway Project Begins the Week of February 26, 2018

Miami, FL – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway construction project the week of February 26, 2018. The project limits extend along SR 5/US 1/South Dixie Highway from the C-100A Canal/SW 106 Street to SW 100 Street in Miami-Dade County. The project will cost an estimated \$2.1 million. The work will take roughly seven months to complete and includes the following:

- Realigning and widening southbound lanes along US 1 north of SW 104 Street
- Adding a northbound exclusive right-turn lane on US 1 from SW 106 Street to SW 104 Street
- Extending the auxiliary lane for the northbound SR 826 ramp
- Modifying/reconstructing affected medians, drainage, sidewalk and pedestrian ramps
- Removing and replacing conflicting landscaping
- Installing a barrier to protect the Busway shelter south of SW 104 Street
- Replacing and upgrading affected traffic signals and signs
- Repaving and restriping the roadway and enhancing crosswalks and crosswalk lighting

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to periodically close lanes. Construction will be done in stages to minimize impacts to the public during special events and peak periods of traffic. The department will make sure traffic continues to flow safely through the work zones.
