## **FDOT to Host a Public Hearing for a Roadway Safety Project**

*State Road (SR) 25/NW 36 Street from NW 5 Avenue to North Miami Avenue*

---

**Miami, FL** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six will host a public hearing for a roadway project along SR 25/NW 36 Street from NW 5 Avenue to North Miami Avenue, in Miami-Dade County. Construction is expected to begin in November 2020 and last four months. The estimated construction cost for this project is about \$464,630.

**The public hearing will be held from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Thursday, June 7, 2018, at the Roberto Clemente Park, 101 NW 34 Street, Miami, FL 33127.** Graphic displays will be shown during the meeting, and FDOT representatives will be available to discuss the project.

The proposed work for this project includes:

- Modifying median opening to restrict the southbound, northbound and westbound left-turn movements at the intersections of NW 3 Avenue and NW 1 Avenue
- Upgrading pedestrian signals at NW 5 Avenue and NW 2 Avenue
- Adding a traffic signal at the northwest corner of NW 36 Street and N. Miami Avenue (northbound)
- Enhancing striping for pedestrian crossings at NW 5 Avenue and NW 2 Avenue
- Repaving and restriping the roadway
