Truck Bypass Construction Project Public Information Meeting on Tuesday, December 10

From west of State Road (SR) 997/Krome Avenue to east of SR 5/US 1 on Campbell Drive, Davis Parkway and Palm Drive

Miami, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a truck bypass construction project the week of January 13, 2020. The project limits extend from west of SR 997/Krome Avenue to east of SR 5/US 1 along SW 312 Street/Campbell Drive, SW 336 Street/Davis Parkway and SR 9336/Palm Drive in the cities of Homestead and Florida City. The purpose of the project is to provide a truck bypass facility and redirect truck traffic from Krome Avenue to US 1, which will remove truck traffic from the Homestead Historic Downtown District.

A Public Information Meeting will take place to discuss this project from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Tuesday, December 10, at the William F. Dickinson Community Center, 1601 N. Krome Avenue, Homestead, Florida 33030. FDOT representatives will provide an overview of the projects and will be available to answer questions.

The project cost is an estimated \$16.3 million. The work will take about 14 months to be completed. The work includes roadway widening and rebuilding; performing drainage work; and installing a new sanitary sewer lift station, lighting, and signalization on the three roadways and a section of US 1.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to periodically close lanes. Construction will be done in stages to minimize impacts to the public during special events and peak periods of traffic. The department will make sure traffic continues to flow safely through the work zones.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
