Construction Completed on State Road (SR) 997/Krome Avenue from SW 232 Street to SW 136 Street

More than 30 miles of Krome Avenue corridor complete

Miami, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) recently completed a roadway construction project along SR 997/Krome Avenue from SW 232 Street to SW 136 Street. The 14-month project, which began in January 2019, featured approximately \$37.8 million in roadway expansion and safety enhancements.

The following work was performed on the project: rebuilding and widening Krome Avenue from two to four lanes with a 40-foot median; constructing a new bridge over C-102 Canal; installing a drainage system; installing lighting along the corridor; installing guardrail in the median; upgrading traffic signals at SW 232 Street, SW 216 Street, SW 200 Street, SW 192 Street and SW 184 Street; providing adequate access management and improving traffic operations throughout the corridor; and, constructing a new multi-use trail for walking and biking.

FDOT completed this project with the support of elected officials and the community. Halley Engineering Contractors, Inc. was the contractor. Overall construction along Krome Avenue started in 2015, and all projects are now complete between Okeechobee Road and SW 232 Street. One more section of the Krome Avenue construction continues between SW 232 and SW 312 Streets.
