### **Closure of the I-95 Ramps to Eastbound I-395**

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The southbound and northbound I-95 ramps to eastbound I-395 will be closed tonight as noted below to allow the project contractor to remove an overhead electronic message board:

#### **Southbound I-95 Ramp to Eastbound I-395 Detour**

On Wednesday, January 13, the southbound I-95 ramp to eastbound I-395 will be closed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. Drivers can:

- Continue south on I-95, exit at the NW 8 Street (Exit 3B)
- Turn left on NW 8 Street, continue east on NW 8 Street
- Turn left at Biscayne Boulevard to access the A1A North/Miami Beach Ramp

#### **Northbound I-95 Ramp to Eastbound I-395 Detour**

On Wednesday, January 13, the northbound I-95 ramp to eastbound I-395 will be closed between the hours of 10 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. Drivers can:

- Exit at the NW 2 Street ramp (Exit 2B)
- Continue north on NW 3 Avenue, then turn right on NW 8 Street
- Continue east on NW/NE 8 Street
- Turn left on Biscayne Boulevard to access A1A North/Miami Beach

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions. The work is part of the I-395/SR 836/I-95 Design-Build Project that will reconstruct the I-395 corridor from the SR 836/I-395/I-95 (Midtown) Interchange to the MacArthur Causeway Bridge, including the construction of a Signature Bridge over NE 2 Avenue and Biscayne Boulevard; double-deck SR 836 from west of NW 17 Avenue to the Midtown Interchange and the replacement of the concrete pavement on I-95 from NW 8 Street to NW 29 Street.
