95 Express Lanes Emergency Stopping Sites Now Open

Miami, FL – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has opened the 95 Express Lanes Emergency Stopping Sites (ESS) in Miami Dade County. This safety initiative, first announced at a press conference in June 2016, involved the construction of five emergency stopping sites along 95 Express from NW 62 Street to NW 131 Street.

The emergency stopping sites consist of 13-foot shoulders, measuring between 1,200 and 1,900 feet in length, that will give law enforcement and motorists more room to pull off the express lanes for emergency stops or enforcement activities. There are three emergency stopping sites on the northbound express lanes and two on the southbound express lanes, as noted in the attached map.

Drivers utilizing the emergency stopping sites should call *FHP (*347) for assistance.

The contractor will continue to work on the concrete replacement project continue along I-95 from NW 29 Street to NW 79 Street. Drivers should expect nighttime and weekend lane closures along this stretch of I-95, as well as the 95 Express Lanes. The concrete replacement project is expected to be completed in the Summer of 2020. **Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions.**
