FDOT Completes ITS Project in Miami-Dade and Monroe Counties

State Road (SR) 9A/I-95, SR 112, and SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has completed an Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) replacement project in Miami-Dade and Monroe counties. The project included work on SR 9A/I-95 and SR 112 in Miami-Dade County and along SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway in Monroe County.

The \$3.8 million design-build project was completed in just over one year with the support of elected officials and the community. Sociedad Ibérica de Construcciones Eléctricas, (SICE) was the contractor. The scope of work for this project included the following:

Miami-Dade County: Replacing 84 ITS cabinets; updating and migrating ITS devices to current standards; replacing 35 ITS power supplies and batteries; and connecting communications between the SR 112 Hub and SR 836 Hub.

Monroe County: Replacing 11 Arterial Dynamic Message (ADMS) Signs on SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway at MM 7.5, 39.5, 91.5, 106, 113 and 126.
