Northbound I-95 Lane Closure August 4

Just south of State Road (SR) 858/Hallandale Beach Boulevard

MIAMI, Fla. – On Wednesday, August 4, one northbound lane will be closed along I-95 just south of the exit ramp at SR 858/Hallandale Beach Boulevard in Broward County. The lane will be closed between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.

This work is being performed as part of the Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Replacement Project, which includes replacing Closed Circuit Television Cameras (CCTV) and installing new poles at various locations.
