Nighttime Closure of Northbound I-95 off-ramp at State Road (SR) 925/NW 3 Avenue Begins Tonight

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning Monday, April 12 through Wednesday, April 14, the northbound I-95 off-ramp to northbound SR 925/NW 3 Avenue (Exit 2B) will be closed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m., for guardrail installation and roadway repaving.

During this closure, motorists will have the option to proceed through the following detours:

- **Exit 2A Detour:** NE 1 Avenue, Flagler Street, NW 2 Avenue and NW 2 Street to access northbound SR 925/NW 3 Avenue
- **Exit 2D Detour:** I-395, Biscayne Boulevard, NW 3 Street, NW 2 Avenue and NW 2 Street to access northbound SR 925/NW 3 Avenue

Drivers should expect delays and seek alternate routes if possible. Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
