Nighttime Paving Along State Road (SR) 976/SW 40 Street Continues May 11

From SW 117 Avenue to SW 102 Avenue

MIAMI, Fla. – On Tuesday, May 11, between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m., the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will continue nightly roadway paving along SR 976/SW 40 Street between SW 117 Avenue to SW 102 Avenue. This operation will be completed in stages to minimize impact to the community and is scheduled to last approximately two months.

During this operation, at least one lane along eastbound and westbound SR 976/SW 40 Street will be closed. Drivers should anticipate delays and seek alternate routes if possible. Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
