Northbound State Road (SR) A1A/Collins Avenue Nighttime Closure March 9

Between 23 Street and 41 Street; Motorists Detoured to Pine Tree Drive

MIAMI, Fla. – On Tuesday night, March 9, northbound SR A1A/Collins Avenue between 23 Street and 41 Street will be closed so the contractor can perform underground site inspections at 36 Street. The closure will take place between 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. During this closure, motorists traveling northbound on SR A1A/Collins Avenue will be directed to:

- Turn west on 23 Street
- Turn north on Pine Tree Drive
- Turn east on 41 Street
- Continue north or south on Collins Avenue

Southbound traffic is not expected to be impacted by the closure. Local traffic will be able to access the area. This work is part of the SR A1A/Collins Avenue Pedestrian Improvement Project.
