State Road (SR) 925/NW 3 Court/NW 3 Avenue Nighttime Paving Begins Tonight

Between NW 8 Street and NW 1 Street

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning tonight, Thursday, March 25 through Friday, April 2, from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will close travel lanes on northbound SR 925/NW 3 Avenue and southbound SR 925/NW 3 Court, to repave the road between NW 8 Street and NW 1 Street.

At least one lane will remain open in each direction. Florida Highway Patrol will direct traffic through the area. Drivers should expect delays and seek alternate routes if possible. Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
