Lane Closures on State Road 5/US 1/Overseas Highway Scheduled For Week of January 25

From Mile Marker (MM) 126 to MM 7.5

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning Tuesday, January 26, lane closures along SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway will be scheduled as noted below:

Mile Marker (MM) 126

Daytime Hour Closures:

Tuesday, January 26 through Thursday, January 28:

- One southbound lane will be closed from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Nighttime Hour Closures:

Tuesday, January 26 through Thursday, January 28:

- Two inside lanes in the northbound direction will be closed from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. The lane closure will extend from Card Sound Road to approximately SW 352 Street.
- Southbound lanes will be closed from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. and traffic will be temporarily diverted through the northbound lane along SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highways.
 - Head south on SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway
 - Turn west on Krome Avenue
 - Head south on Krome Avenue
 - Turn east on SW 352 Street
 - Turn south on US 1

Daytime Hour Closures:

Thursday, January 28:

- One inside lane in the northbound direction will be closed from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Nighttime Hour Closures:

Thursday, January 28:

- One inside lane in the northbound direction will be closed from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Two southbound lanes will be closed from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m., and traffic will be temporarily diverted through the northbound lanes along SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway.

Wednesday, January 26 and Thursday, January 28:

- One inside lane in the northbound and southbound direction will be closed from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
