Intersection Enhancement Project Begins Week of November 3

State Road (SR) 922/NE 125 Street and NE 10 Avenue

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin an intersection enhancement project the week of November 3, 2020 on SR 922/NE 125 Street at NE 10 Avenue in the City of North Miami. The project will cost an estimated \$589,600 and will be completed spring 2021.

The scope of work includes: replacing existing traffic signals at the intersection; installing stormwater drainage; upgrading pedestrian ramps; repaving and resurfacing the roadway; and installing new signage and pavement markings.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. weekdays and weekends, 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday and 11 p.m. to 7 a.m., Fridays and Saturdays. Sidewalks will be closed as needed. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction-related impacts. Please use caution when traveling through construction zones.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
