UPDATE: Intersection Enhancement Project Rescheduled to Start Week of February 1

State Road (SR) 922/NE 125 Street and NE 10 Avenue

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has rescheduled the intersection enhancement project to begin the week of February 1, 2021. The project is located at the intersection of SR 922/NE 125 Street and NE 10 Avenue in the City of North Miami. The project will cost an estimated \$589,600 and is anticipated to be completed by summer 2021.

The scope of work includes: replacing existing traffic signals at the intersection, installing drainage, upgrading pedestrian ramps, repaving and resurfacing the roadway, and installing new signage and pavement markings.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. weekdays and weekends, 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday and 11 p.m. to 7 a.m., Friday and Saturday nights. Sidewalk detours may be used as needed during the work. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction-related impacts. Please use caution when traveling through construction zones.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
