SR 925/NW 3 Court/NW 3 Avenue Lane Closures Begin Tonight

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning tonight, Monday, March 15 through Thursday, March 18, temporary lane closures and detours will be established at the following intersections between 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. for traffic signal work.

NW 3 Court at NW 5 Street (eastbound closure underneath I-95): Motorists will turn right onto southbound SR 925/NW 3 Court; turn left onto NW 4 Street; and turn left onto northbound SR 925/NW 3 Avenue in order access NW 5 Street.

NW 3 Avenue at NW 2 Street (westbound closure underneath I-95): Motorists will turn right on northbound SR 925/NW 3 Avenue; turn left onto NW 3 Street; and turn left onto southbound SR 925/NW 3 Court to access NW 2 Street.

NW 3 Avenue at NW 2 Street (eastbound closure underneath I-95): Motorists will turn right onto southbound SR 925/NW 3 Court; turn right onto NW 1 Street; turn left onto NW North River Drive; turn left onto West Flagler Street; and turn left onto northbound NW 2 Avenue to access NW 2 Street.

Only one intersection will be closed at a time and police officers will direct traffic through the area during this work.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
