### Bridge Rehabilitation Project and Closure Begins February 8

*State Road 994/Quail Roost Drive/SW 200 Street over the C-102 Canal/SW 204 Street*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a bridge rehabilitation project the week of February 8, 2021. The project limits extend along State Road (SR) 994/Quail Roost Drive/SW 200 Street Bridge over the C-102 Canal/SW 204 Street. The bridge will be closed for the duration of the project. This project cost is an estimated \$291,080.

The work will last roughly three months and it includes the following: repairing the bridge deck; replacing the expansion joints of the bridge; and reinstalling the asphalt overlay on top of the bridge.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to fully close the bridge for approximately three continuous months. Please follow the detour routes below when traveling on Quail Roost Drive/SW 200 Street, and use caution when driving through the area:

When traveling westbound, head:

- South on Naranja Road/SW 147 Avenue
- West on SW 216 Street
- North on SW 167 Avenue

When traveling eastbound, head:

- South on SW 167 Avenue
- East on SW 216 Street
- North on Naranja Road/SW 147 Avenue

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
