State Road (SR) 9 Roadway Project Completed Ahead of Schedule

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has successfully completed the SR 9/NW 27 Avenue Roadway Construction Project from SR 934/NW 79 Street to SR 932/NW 103 Street, in Miami-Dade County, ahead of schedule. FDOT completed this work with the support of elected officials and the community. The seven-month project began on May 12, 2020 and cost an estimated \$1.5 million. The contractor, LEAD Engineering, earned an incentive of \$100,000 for early completion.

The following scope of work was performed on this project: installing new drainage inlets and pipes to connect to the existing drainage system; reconstructing driveways that restrict waterflow; reconstructing sidewalks, pedestrian ramps, bicycle lanes, and curb and gutter; and repaving and restriping the roadway.
