### **FDOT to begin SR A1A/Collins Avenue Safety Improvement Project June 1**

*From 91 Street to 92 Street*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a pedestrian and bicycle safety project the week of June 1, 2021, along SR A1A/Collins Avenue from 91 Street and 92 Street, in Miami Beach. The project will cost an estimated \$230,505.

This project is part of a district-wide pushbutton contract. The work will last roughly six months and it includes the following: improving signalization and lighting; improving existing drainage structures; installing ADA: constructing high emphasis pedestrian crosswalk at the intersection of Collins Avenue and 92 Street; improving lighting; and installing signage and pavement markings.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes, sidewalks and establish detours at times. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction related impacts. Please use caution when traveling through the construction zone.

**Please note this this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.**
