### **Northbound SW 137 Avenue Lane Closure to Eastbound State Road (SR) 90/SW 8 Street Begins April 14**

**MIAMI, Fla.** – Beginning Wednesday, April 14 through Thursday April 15, the right turn lane along northbound SW 137 Avenue to eastbound SR 90/SW 8 Street will be closed between the hours of 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., to perform a drill shaft operation and begin pedestrian and signalization improvements.

During this closure, motorists will be permitted to turn right onto eastbound SR 90/SW 8 Street using the outside through lane of northbound SW 137 Avenue.

Drivers should anticipate delays and seek alternate routes if possible. Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
