W 84 Street/Graham Dairy Road Closed January 16

From Hialeah Gardens Boulevard to West 32 Avenue

Miami, Fla. – On Saturday, January 16, 2021, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., W 84 Street/Graham Dairy Road from Hialeah Gardens Blvd to W 32 Avenue, will be closed for sod installation. During this closure, the following detours will be implemented:

- Motorists traveling along westbound W 84 Street/Graham Dairy Road to Hialeah Gardens Boulevard will be detoured south on W 32 Avenue and west on W 80 Street to proceed to Hialeah Gardens Boulevard.
- Motorists traveling along Hialeah Gardens Boulevard to W 84 Street/Graham Dairy Road will be detoured east on W 80 Street and north on W 32 Avenue to proceed to W 84 Street/Graham Dairy Road.

Drivers should anticipate delays and seek alternate routes if possible. Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
