- ✓ Coordination with federal and local governments, TPOs, County Commissions and municipalities

FDOT District Six



- Includes Miami-Dade & Monroe counties– more than **2.8 million residents**
- District's state road system
 - 700 centerline miles
 - 3,044 lane miles
- Served by
 - 7 public airports
 - 78 private airports
 - 2 rail lines
 - 2 deep-water ports
 - 3 rail fixed guideway systems
- More than **34 million vehicle miles daily**



About FDOT's Five-Year Work Program

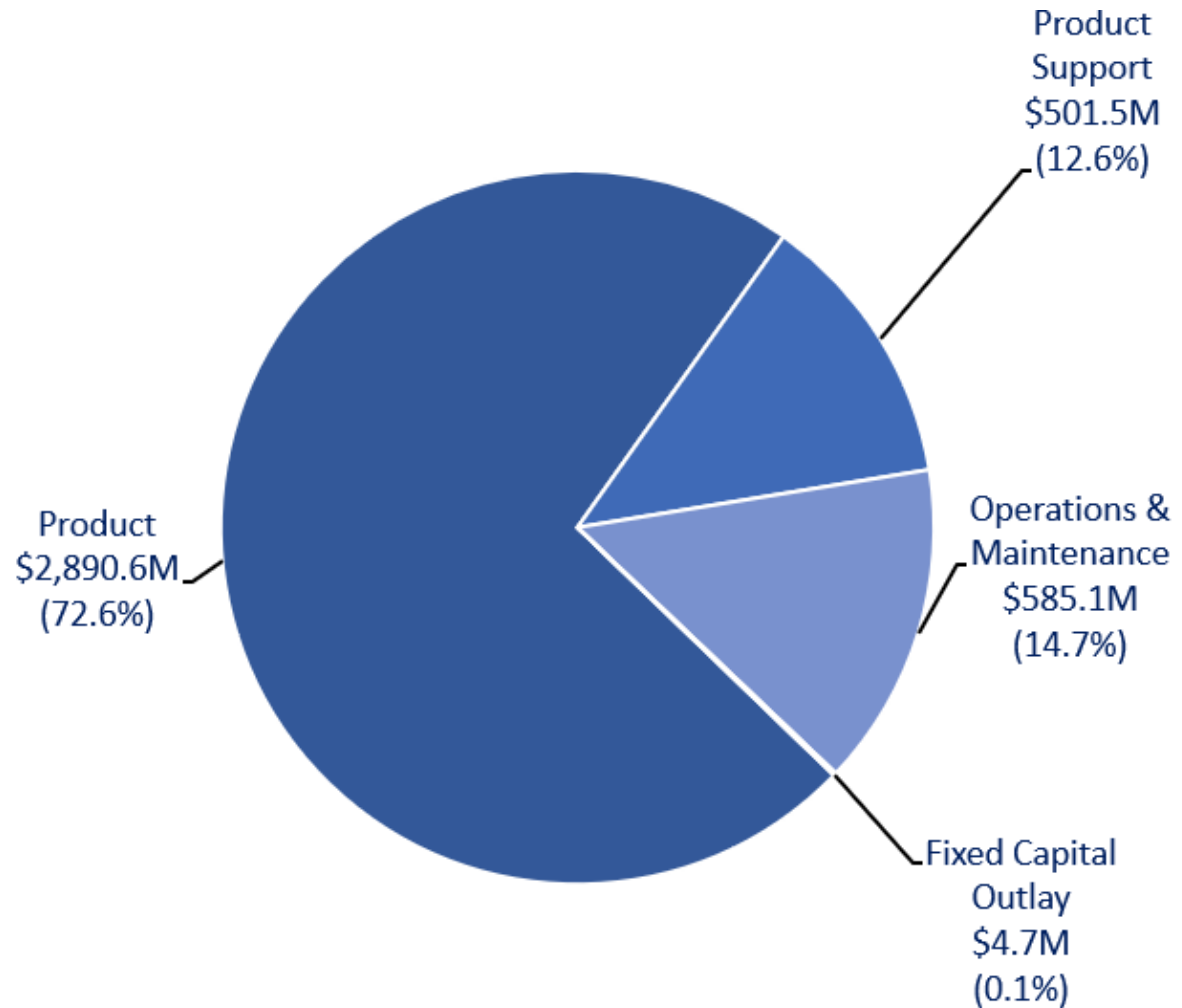
Work Program Accelerated Cycle

- June – August:** District interacts with county officials
- October:** Conduct Public hearings
Monroe County Commission review
- November:** FDOT staff in Tallahassee compiles District plans to create the Statewide Tentative Work Program
- December:** Statewide Preliminary Tentative Work Program sent to Governor's Office, Legislature, Florida Transportation Commission & Department of Economic Opportunity
- January :** Florida Transportation Commission conducts a statewide public hearing to receive public input for the Tentative Work Program
- July:** After the appropriations are approved by the Legislature, the Work Program is adopted by the FDOT State Secretary



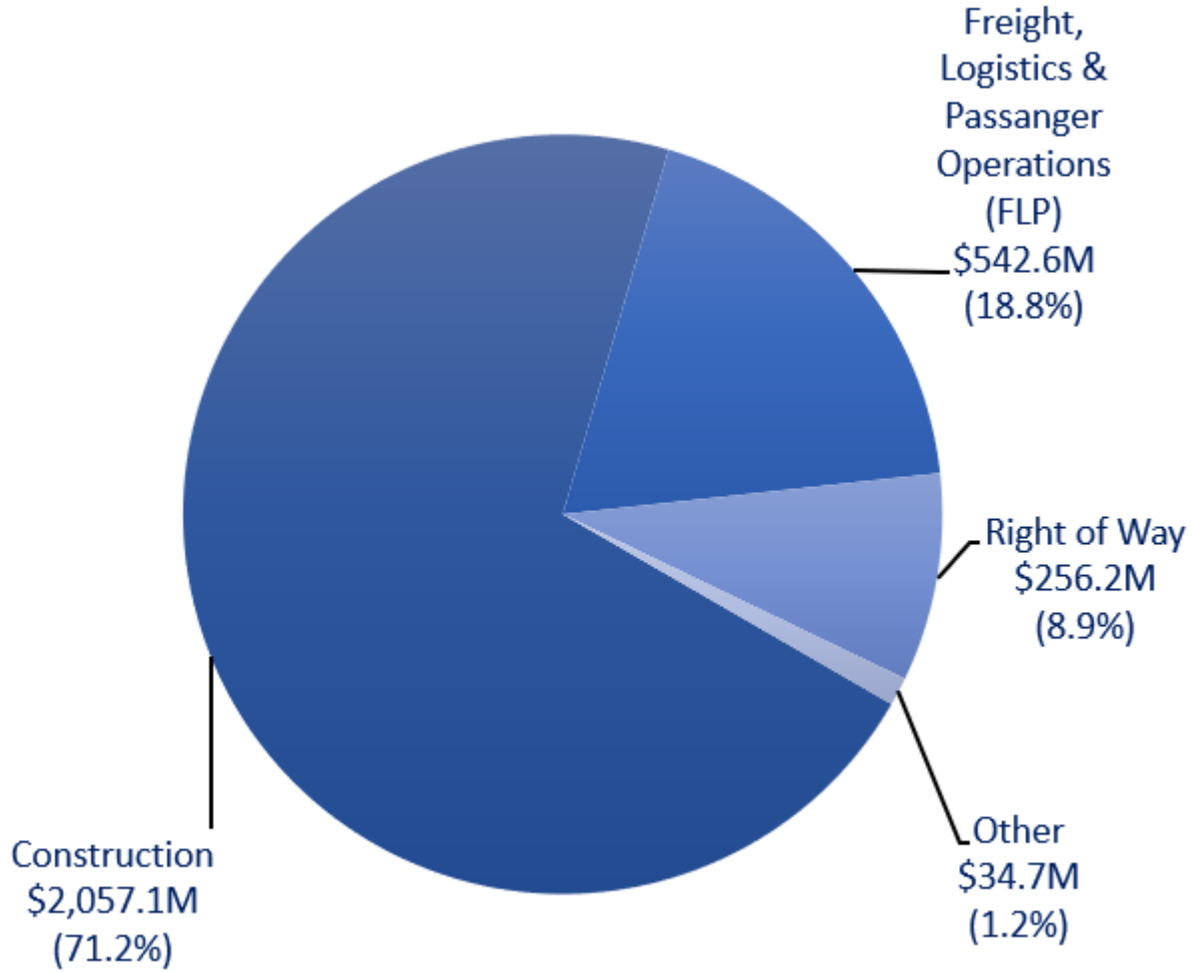

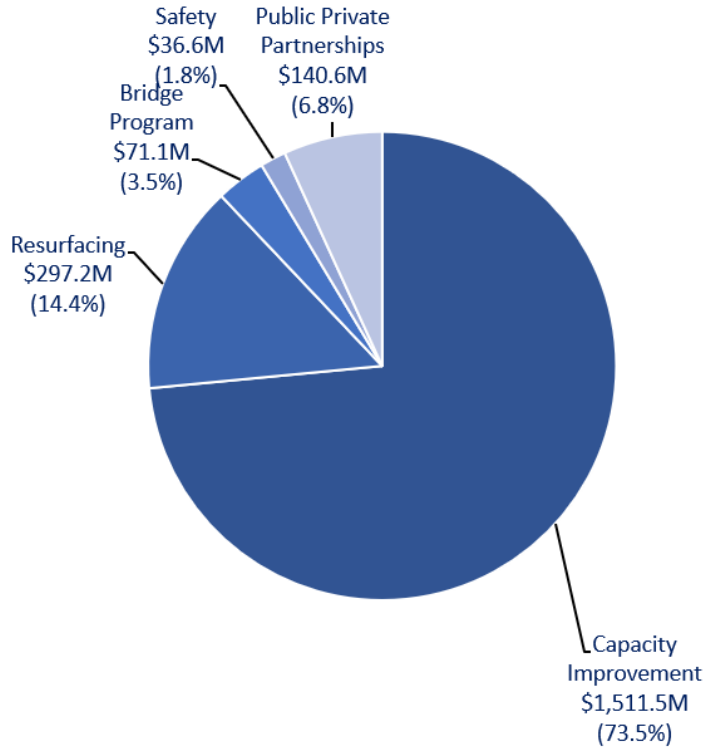

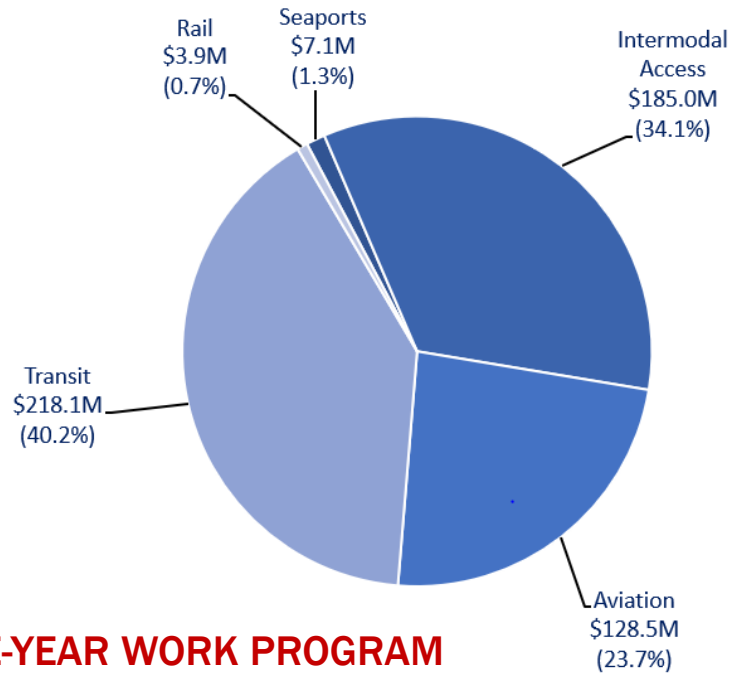
