- ***Reduce your speed and obey the posted school zone speed limits (15 mph)***
- ***Always stop for the school bus that has stopped to load/unload children***
- ***Be alert and ready to stop. Watch for children, especially where there are no sidewalks***
- ***Give children on bicycles lots of room***
- ***Expect more traffic on the roads and factor this into your daily commute***

With more cars expected to be on the roads, FDOT encourages drivers and families to check with 511 before leaving home. Being aware of current road conditions and accidents allows drivers to plan ahead, save time and stay safe.
