Pedestrian Bridge Project

Project Identification Number: 447046-1-52-01

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has completed the design for a replacement pedestrian bridge over SR 90/US 41/SW 8 Street and the C-4 Canal, west of SW 109 Avenue in Miami-Dade County. The project was let on October 25, 2023 and is scheduled to begin construction in July 2024

PROJECT DETAILS

- Installing a pedestrian bridge over SW 8 Street and the C-4 Canal, west of SW 109 Avenue
- Providing pedestrian plazas with elevators and stairs on the north-end and south-end landings of the pedestrian bridge
- Installing a signalized east/west crosswalk along SW 109 Avenue, north of SW 7 Terrace
- Upgrading pedestrian signals, signs and curb ramps
- Closing existing historical bridge over the C-4 Canal east of SW 109 Avenue
- Eliminating north/south crosswalks at the SW 8 Street and SW 109 Avenue intersection
- Removing remaining portions of existing structure in conflict with proposed improvements

PROJECT DATES

Construction work is expected to begin in July 2024 and last about two years. Please note the construction duration is subject to change.
