FDOT to Host an Alternatives Public Meeting for State Road (SR) 934/ NE 79 Street Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study

Virtual: October 2, 2023, from 6 p.m. – 8 p.m. In-Person: October 5, 2023, from 6 p.m. – 8 p.m.

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six will host an Alternatives Public Meeting for the SR 934/NE 79 Street (John F. Kennedy Causeway) PD&E Study from west of Pelican Harbor Drive to east of Adventure Avenue.

The public can participate in the Alternatives Public Meeting in-person or virtually. The same materials will be displayed and presented at both the in-person and online events and will also be posted by September 25, 2023, on the project webpage at www.fdotmiamidade.com/79thstreetbridgespdestudy.html.

The objective of this study is to evaluate bridge replacement alternatives to address structural deficiencies of four existing bridges (two bridge pairs) along SR 934/NE 79 Street.
