## **FDOT to Host Public Meeting for Two Roadway Projects**

State Road (SR) 9A/I-95

*Miami*, *FL* – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six is developing the design for two roadway projects along SR 9A/I-95 from NW 8 Street to NW 79 Street, in Miami-Dade County.

The public information meeting will be held **from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Wednesday, March 11, 2015 at Moore Park Community Center, 765 NW 36 Street, Miami, FL 33127.** Attendees may arrive at any time from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Graphic displays of the project will be shown and FDOT staff will be on hand to discuss the projects and answer questions.

The proposed work for these projects includes:

- Replacing and reconstructing the pavement along the road and ramps
- Upgrading existing bridge railings
- Upgrading drainage
- Installing and implementing Intelligent Transportation System (ITS)-related equipment including electronic message signs and ramp signals

Construction is expected to begin in September 2017 and last about two years for the portion from NW 8 Street to NW 29 Street and last about three years for the portion from NW 29 Street to NW 79 Street. The estimated construction cost of the projects is \$70 million.
