Traffic Shift on West Flagler Street

Miami, FL — On Saturday morning, April 18, all eastbound travel lanes on West Flagler Street between NW 78 Avenue and NW 76 Avenue will be shifted to the north side of the roadway. This new traffic pattern is expected to be in place for approximately two months.

In order to complete the traffic shift all westbound and eastbound travel lanes on West Flagler Street will be closed in the area underneath State Road (SR) 826 on Friday, April 17 (Saturday, April 18 is an alternate date), between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.

- Drivers on northbound SR 826 exiting at West Flagler Street heading west can:
 - Continue north on SR 826 to NW 25 Street
 - Turn left and access southbound SR 826 entrance ramp
 - Take southbound exit at West Flagler Street
- Westbound drivers on West Flagler Street can:
 - Enter northbound SR 826 to NW 25 Street
 - Turn left and access southbound SR 826 entrance ramp
 - Take southbound exit at West Flagler Street
- Eastbound drivers on West Flagler Street can:
 - Enter southbound SR 826
 - Exit SW 8 Street east
 - Enter northbound SR 826
 - Exit West Flagler Street
- Drivers on southbound SR 826 heading east on West Flagler can:
 - Exit SW 8 Street east
 - Enter northbound SR 826
 - Exit West Flagler Street

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions.
