Traffic Pattern Change on NW 87 Avenue

Doral, FL – On Friday, May 29, all traffic on NW 87 Avenue between NW 21 Terrace and NW 27 Street will be shifted to the west side of the roadway and the travel lanes will be configured as follows:

Lane configuration on NW 87 Avenue between NW 21 Terrace and NW 27 Street:

- **Northbound** travel lanes on NW 87 Avenue will have two through lanes, one left turn lane and one right turn lane.
- **Southbound** travel lanes on NW 87 Avenue will have two through lanes and one left turn lane.

This traffic pattern is expected to be in place for approximately six to eight weeks and will allow the contractor to reconstruct the east side of NW 87 Avenue between NW 27 Street and NW 21 Terrace. In order to prepare for the traffic pattern change, the contractor will schedule the following closures:

All southbound lanes will be closed on NW 87 Avenue between NW 27 Street and NW 21 Terrace on Thursday, May 28, between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. Drivers can:

- Go west on NW 27 Street, south on NW 89 Court
- West on NW 25 Street, south on NW 89 Place
- East on NW 23 Street, south on NW 88 Court
- East on NW 21 Terrace to connect with NW 87 Avenue

One northbound lane on NW 87 Avenue will closed between NW 21 Terrace and NW 27 Street between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions.
