## **FDOT Hosts Traditional and Online Public Hearings for Input on District Six's Five-Year Tentative Work Plan**

*Miami, FL* – More than \$3 billion will be spent by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) over the next five years to improve transportation infrastructure in Miami-Dade and Monroe counties. The five-year plan, known as the Tentative Work Program, will be highlighted at the annual FDOT District Six Work Program Public Hearings.

The two public hearings in Miami-Dade and Monroe counties, along with the ability for the public to participate via webcast, will provide an opportunity for the public to ask questions or make comments about the Work Program in general, as well as specific projects included in the plan.
