## State Road (SR) 7/NW 7 Avenue

Weekend Closure at the intersection of NW 14 Street and NW 7 Avenue begins Friday, September 25

*Miami*, *FL* – Beginning the evening of Friday, September 25, the contractor for the SR 7/NW 7 Avenue project will close the intersection of NW 7 Avenue at NW 14 Street in order to install the sanitary sewer at that location as the first part of the reconstruction of the roadway in this area. This will be a continuous closure through the weekend. The intersection is scheduled to reopen by 5:30 a.m. on Monday, September 28. Local traffic will be maintained but minimally restricted in the area.

A detour will be established for drivers traveling north, south and west in this area.

Drivers traveling north on NW 7 Avenue who wish to continue north on NW 7 Avenue will have to:

- Turn west on NE 11 Street
- Continue north on NW 10 Avenue/9 Avenue
- Turn east on NW 17 Street
- Turn north on NW 7 Avenue

Drivers traveling south on NW 7 Avenue who wish to continue south on NW 7 Avenue will have to:

- Turn west on NW 17 Street
- Continue south on NW 10 Avenue/9 Avenue
- Turn east on NE 10 Street
- Turn south on NW 7 Avenue

Drivers traveling west on NW 14 Street who wish to get on NW 7 Avenue will have to:

- Turn north on NW 3 Avenue
- Turn west on NW 17 Street
- Turn north/south on NW 7 Avenue

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
