## Closure to Occur on West 65 Street at Red Road

State Road 823/NW 57 Avenue/West 4 Avenue/Red Road

*Hialeah*, *FL* – Starting October 26, 2015, a full closure will occur on West 65 Street at NW 57 Avenue/West 4 Avenue/Red Road while the contractor performs drainage improvements and road reconstruction activities. A detour will be in place, but motorists are encouraged to seek alternate routes. This will be a 24 hour closure and will last approximately two weeks, weather permitting.

Please note that NW 57 Avenue/West 4 Avenue/Red Road and the frontage road will remain open during this work.

## Drivers traveling west on West 65 Street can:

- Turn north at Red Road until West 68 Street
- Go west on West 68 Street
- Turn south on West 6 Court
- Turn west back onto West 65 Drive

or

- Turn south at Red Road until NW 114 Street/West 60 Street
- Turn north at the Frontage Road
- Turn west back onto West 65 Street

## Drivers traveling east on W 65 Street can:

- Turn south at the frontage road
- Go east on NW 114 Street/West 60 Street
- Go north on Red Road
- Turn east back onto West 65 Street

This work is part of the overall improvements along SR 823/NW 57 Avenue/West 4 Avenue, underway from West 53 Street to West 84 Street in the City of Hialeah. The project began January 2015 and is estimated to last through June 2017 with an estimated cost of almost \$41 million.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
