## Nighttime Closure of Eastbound NW 25 Street at NW 79 Avenue

**Doral** – The following closures will be implemented to allow the contractor to work on a bridge over the roadway:

All eastbound travel lanes on NW 25 Street will be closed at NW 79 Avenue Monday, November 16, between the hours of 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

Eastbound drivers on NW 25 Street can:

- Go north on NW 79 Avenue
- East on NW 36 Street
- South on NW 72 Avenue/Milam Dairy Road to connect with NW 25 Street

**NOTE:** Access to the Shoppes at MICC will be provided via the signalized intersection at NW 79 Avenue. Drivers exiting the center driveway (NW 78 Avenue) will only be able to go westbound on NW 25 Street.

NW 79 Avenue will be closed at NW 25 Street on Tuesday, November 17, Wednesday, November 18 and Thursday, November 19 between the hours of 10:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Eastbound and westbound drivers on NW 25 Street will be allowed to cross NW 79 Avenue, however left turns will not be permitted

Drivers going south on NW 79 Avenue to eastbound NW 25 Street can:

- Turn west on NW 29 Street
- Turn south on NW 82 Avenue
- Turn east on NW 25 Street

**NOTE:** Drivers on westbound NW 25 Street going to the Shoppes at MICC can turn left at NW 78 Avenue to access the shopping center. Drivers exiting the Shoppes at MICC and going west on NW 25 Street can do so by exiting at the driveway located at NW 78 Avenue.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions.
