## Florida Department of Transportation to Hold Public Meeting

*State Road (SR) 5/North Roosevelt Boulevard  
Pedestrian High-intensity Activated Crosswalks (HAWKs) and Street Lighting  
Safety Improvement Project*

---

**Monroe County, FL** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a safety improvement project the week of February 25, 2019, which encompasses the construction of pedestrian High-intensity Activated Crosswalks (HAWKs) and street lighting at five existing mid-block crossing locations along SR 5/North Roosevelt Boulevard in the City of Key West, Monroe County, FL.

A public meeting will be held **Tuesday, February 12, 2019, from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., at the Monroe County Harvey Government Center, 1200 Truman Avenue, Key West, FL 33040.** This meeting will be held in an informal, open house format with no formal presentation and will offer an opportunity for the public to learn about the project and provide feedback.

The proposed work for this project includes installing pedestrian HAWKs at five mid-block crossings along North Roosevelt Boulevard near the 24 North Hotel, the Capital Bank and the Key Plaza Shopping Center, between 7 Street and Hilton Haven Road and just west of 3 Street. The project will also include upgrading pedestrian signing, street lighting and pavement markings, as well as repaving and restriping isolated sections of the road along the project's corridor.
