Roadway Construction Project Begins the Week of July 15

State Road (SR) 94/SW 88 Street/N Kendall Drive

Miami, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway construction project the week of July 15, 2019. The project limits extend along SR 94/SW 88 Street/N Kendall Drive from SW 79 Avenue to SR 5/US 1/South Dixie Highway. This project will cost an estimated \$2.2 million.

The work will last roughly eight months and includes the following: Restricting left-turn movement from westbound SW 88 Street to southbound SW 72 Avenue; installing dedicated left-turn lane at SW 88 Street/N Kendall Drive and SW 7200 Block; reconfiguring northbound SW 77 Avenue lanes; installing new pedestrian crosswalk at SW 73 Place, Dadeland Boulevard and SW 7200 Block; improving/installing drainage; repaving and restriping the roadway; improving intersection pedestrian lighting at SR 5/US 1/South Dixie Highway and SW 88 Street/N Kendall Drive, upgrading pedestrian curb ramps, signing, pavement markings, signal heads and video detection cameras for six signalized intersections.

To complete this work safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes at times. Tasks will be done in stages and lane closures will be scheduled to keep traffic moving and avoid special community events.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
