Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Project Begun *SR 9A/I-95 and SR 112 in Miami-Dade County*

Miami, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has begun an ITS construction project. The project limits extend along SR 9A/I-95 from NW 46 Street to NW 165 Street; and along SR 112 at NW 12 Avenue and NW 10 Avenue, in Miami-Dade County. This project will cost an estimated \$3.8 million and will take roughly a year to complete.

In Miami-Dade County, construction includes the following work: replacing ITS cabinets, updating and migrating ITS devices to current standards, replacing ITS Uninterruptable Power Supply (UPS) units and batteries, connecting communications between the SR 112 Hub and SR 836 Hub.

Additional work under this contract will be performed in Monroe County which is expected to begin in March 2020. This project consists of replacing arterial incident management Dynamic Message Signs (DMS) along SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway at MM 7.5, 39.5, 91.5, 106, 113 and 126.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to periodically close lanes. Construction will be done in stages to minimize impacts to the public during special events and peak periods of traffic. The department will make sure traffic continues to flow safely through the work zones.
