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**Brickell Avenue Bridge Project Postponed to February 2020**

*State Road (SR) 90/US 41/Brickell Avenue Bridge over the Miami River*

**Miami, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation, in coordination with the City of Miami, has postponed the start date of the Brickell Avenue Bridge Rehabilitation Project until February 2020 in order to minimize potential impacts during the upcoming Super Bowl and other major events in the area. The project limits extend along SR 90/US 41/Brickell Avenue Bridge over the Miami River in the City of Miami. This project will last approximately nine months and cost an estimated \$4 million.

The work to be performed along the Brickell Avenue Bridge includes adding pedestrian gates, repairing mechanical and electrical bridge components, painting the bridge and replacing lighting at the Tequesta family sculpture, bridge barrier and Riverwalk.

To complete this work safely, it will be necessary to periodically close travel lanes. Construction will be done in stages with lane closures scheduled to avoid special community events and peak periods of traffic. The Department will make sure that traffic continues to flow safely through the work zone.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
