**FDOT to Hold Public Information Workshops for
Kendall Drive Rapid Transit
Project Development & Environment (PD&E) Study**
*State Road (SR) 94/Kendall Drive/SW 88 Street
from SR 997/Krome Avenue/SW 177 Avenue to Dadeland North Metrorail Station*

Miami, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six scheduled its second series of Public Workshops to discuss the Kendall Drive Rapid Transit PD&E Study along SR 94/ Kendall Drive/SW 88 Street from SR 997/Krome Avenue/SW 177 Avenue to Dadeland North Metrorail Station in Miami-Dade County, Florida.

The Workshops will follow an informal format allowing the public to arrive at any time from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m., with a formal presentation starting at 6:30 p.m. Graphic displays will be shown and FDOT representatives will be available to discuss the project and answer questions.

The Kendall corridor is being studied as a part of the Strategic Miami Area Rapid Transit, or SMART Plan, which identifies the development of six rapid transit corridors that directly support the mobility of our future population and employment growth in Miami-Dade County. This study will focus on improving SR 94/Kendall Drive/SW 88 Street through the implementation of a cost-effective, high-ridership new rapid transit service with supporting pedestrian and bicycle facilities. The Workshops will provide an opportunity for the public to view transportation improvements and alternatives for the Kendall Drive corridor.
