I-95, 95 Express Lanes, State Road (SR) 112 and I-195 Lane Closures

Miami, Fla. – The following closures on I-95, 95 Express Lanes, SR 112 and I-195 will be scheduled as noted below:

SPECIAL NOTES:

- Drivers should expect delays when traveling along the closure limits. Drivers are encouraged to seek alternate routes during closures.
- Please note that there will be no construction activities while the newly poured concrete pavement cures.

CLOSURES:

- Monday, February 3 through Thursday, February 6 - The eastbound SR 112 and westbound I-195 ramps to northbound I-95 will be closed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. Drivers can:
 - Go south on I-95, exit at NW 8 Street, then turn left on NW 8 Street.
 - Turn left on NW 3 Avenue to access I-95 north.
- Monday, February 3 through Wednesday, February 5 -There will be a full closure of NW 36 Street from NW 7 Avenue to NW 5 Avenue between 8:30 p.m. and 6 a.m. on Friday to allow the project contractor to replace the traffic railing on the ramps over the roadways. Drivers should follow the posted detour signs.
- Monday, February 3 through Thursday, February 6 - The northbound I-95 ramps to westbound SR 112 and eastbound I-195 will be closed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. Drivers can:
 - Continue north on I-95 and exit at NW 62 Street.
 - Turn left at NW 62 Street, then go south on I-95 to access the ramps to SR 112 and I-195.
- Monday, February 3 through Thursday, February 6 - The southbound I-95 exit ramp to NW 62 Street will be closed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. Drivers can:
 - Exit at the NW 79 Street/NW 81 Street ramp, turn right on NW 81 Street.
 - Turn left on NW 7 Avenue to connect with NW 62 Street.
- Monday, February 3 through Thursday, February 6 - Up to three I-95 northbound general-purpose lanes will be closed from NW 29 Street to NW 79 Street between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m.
- Monday, February 3 through Thursday, February 6 - Up to three southbound, I-95 general-purpose lanes will be closed from NW 54 Street to NW 32 Street between the hours of 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

- Wednesday, February 5 and Thursday, February 6 - The NW 62 Street entrance ramp to northbound I-95 will be closed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. Drivers can:
 - Go north on NW 7 Avenue.
 - Turn right on NW 79 Street to access the northbound I-95 entrance ramp.
- Wednesday, February 5 and Thursday, February 6 - The NW 69 Street entrance ramp to northbound I-95 will be closed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. Drivers can:
 - Turn right on NW 5 Court, then make a left at NW 71 Street.
 - Turn right on NW 7 Avenue.
 - Turn right on NW 79 Street to access the northbound I-95 entrance ramp.
- Thursday, February 6 - NW 7 Avenue will be closed from NW 46 Street to NW 36 Street between the hours of 8:30 p.m. and 6 a.m.
 - Drivers on northbound NW 7 Avenue can:
 - Turn right on NW 36 Street, then turn left on NW 3 Avenue.
 - Turn left on NW 46 Street to access NW 7 Avenue.
 - Drivers on southbound NW 7 Avenue can:
 - Turn right on NW 46 Street, then turn left on NW 10 Avenue.
 - Turn left on NW 36 Street to access NW 7 Avenue.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions. The closures are part of I-95 Design/Build Projects to construct five emergency stopping sites on I-95, from NW 62 Street to NW 131 Street, and replace the concrete pavement from NW 29 Street to NW 79 Street, as well as the Intelligent Transportation System devices.
