Brickell Avenue Bridge Full Closure and Detour Begins Tonight, May 12

Miami, Fla. – Beginning Tuesday, May 12 at 8 p.m. until 8 a.m. the following morning, Brickell Avenue Bridge will be closed to vehicular traffic and a detour will be in place. This full closure and vehicular detour will repeat on Wednesday, May 13, from 8 p.m. until 8 a.m. and Thursday, May 14 from 8 p.m. until 8 a.m. Motorists traveling toward the Brickell Avenue Bridge along southbound SE 2 Avenue or northbound Brickell Avenue will be detoured to the Miami Avenue Bridge. Pedestrian access will be maintained along the northbound side of the Brickell Avenue Bridge.

These closures will allow crews to work on installing the new span lock system and painting the bridge. The following detours will be in place:

- Motorists traveling along southbound SE 2 Avenue who wish to cross the Miami River can:
 - Turn left onto eastbound SE 4 Street or SE 3 Street.
 - Turn left onto northbound SE 3 Avenue.
 - Turn left onto westbound SE 2 Street.
 - Turn left onto southbound S Miami Avenue to access the Miami Avenue Bridge.

- Motorists traveling along northbound Brickell Avenue who wish to cross the Miami River can:
 - Turn left onto westbound SE 7 Street.
 - Turn right onto northbound S Miami Avenue to access the Miami Avenue Bridge.
