SR 90/US 41/Brickell Avenue Bridge across the Miami River Notice of Temporary Change to the Drawbridge Operating Schedule

December 31, 2024

MIAMI, Fla. – The United States Coast Guard (USCG) received a request to temporarily change the drawbridge operation regulation 33 CFR 117.305(b) that governs the State Road (SR) 90/US 41/Brickell Avenue Bridge across the Miami River, mile 0.1, at Miami, FL. In response to this request, The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is authorized to perform a temporary deviation of bridge operation.

Under this temporary deviation, the (SR) 90/US 41/Brickell Avenue need only open on the hour and half hour on Tuesday, December 31, 2024 from 10 p.m. until 1 a.m. on Wednesday, January 1, 2025. Public vessels of the United States, tugs and tugs with tows shall be passed at any time. This action is to assist with vehicle and pedestrian congestion prior to and immediately after Miami's New Year's Eve Bash 2024.

The U.S. Coast Guard will announce the temporary change to the bridge operating regulations in the Local Notice to Mariners and via a Broadcast Notice to Mariners.
