### **Brickell Avenue Weeknight Lane Closures Begin Monday, August 12**

*At the intersection of SR 913/Rickenbacker Causeway*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – Contractors for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will close travel lanes on Brickell Avenue, as needed, from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., beginning Monday, August 12 to safely remove the metal containment platform underneath the westbound State Road (SR) 913/Rickenbacker Causeway Flyover Bridge. At least one lane will remain open in each direction and all lanes will reopen by 6 a.m.

Nightly lane closures will continue through Thursday, August 15. Work zones will be clearly marked and access to and from adjacent homes and businesses will be maintained.
