State Road (SR) 112/I-195/Julia Tuttle Causeway Continuous Lane Closure Begins Friday, October 13

One eastbound lane continuously closed; Two eastbound lanes nightly

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning Friday night, October 13 through Monday morning, October 16 one eastbound inside lane along SR 112/I-195/Julia Tuttle Causeway will be continuously closed for median work and guardrail installation. A second eastbound lane will close nightly at 9 p.m. to perform the median reconstruction work. At least one eastbound lane will remain open at all times. Lane closures will be as follows:

Friday, October 13 – Two eastbound lanes along SR 112/I-195/Julia Tuttle Causeway will be closed from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

Saturday, October 14 – One eastbound inside lane along SR 112/I-195/Julia Tuttle Causeway will remain continuously closed. A second inside eastbound lane will be closed from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

Sunday, October 15 – One eastbound inside lane along SR 112/I-195/Julia Tuttle Causeway will remain continuously closed. A second inside eastbound lane will be closed from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. All three lanes will be open by 5:30 a.m., Monday, October 16.

Westbound traffic will not be impacted. Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
